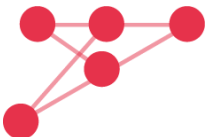


School website

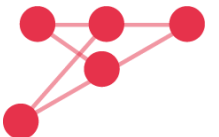


School hours

School opens at 08:00 for all students. Primary students are supervised in the Aula before going to their classrooms at 08:20. Secondary students are welcome to wait in the Secondary Library.

Primary student lessons start at 08:30 and finish at 14:30 every day. It is very important to be on time for school, **learning starts promptly at 08:30.**

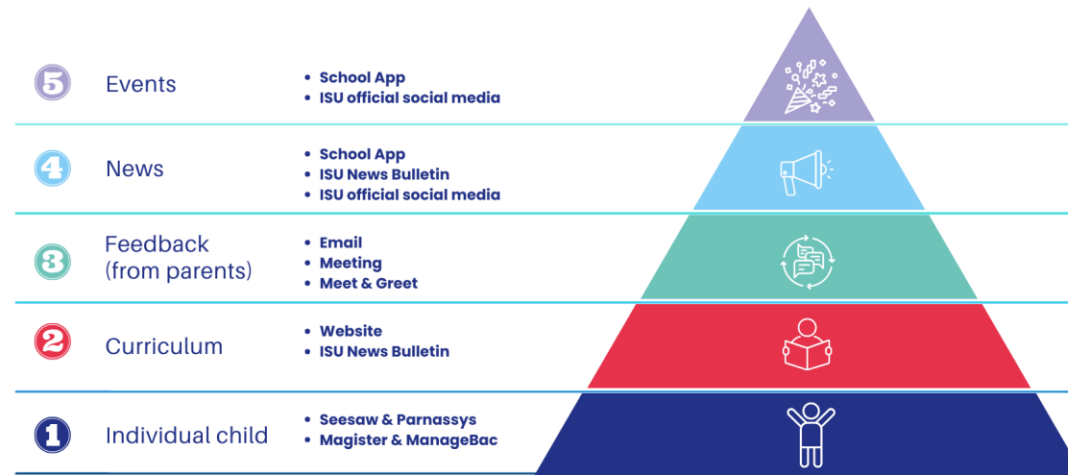
Secondary students have their lessons according to a timetable. We strive to finish most secondary classes at 14:30, however older students might occasionally finish at 15:30 or 16:45.



ISU Parent Communication

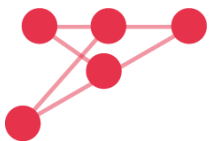
At ISU, we have an official Parent Communication Protocol that outlines how and when we communicate with families across different areas, including:

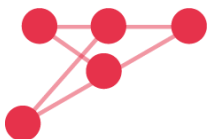

Primary – What to bring to school

Important: Indoor and Outdoor Shoes (All Primary Students)

All Primary students need:

- A pair of indoor shoes to be kept at school and worn in class
 - A pair of outdoor shoes suitable for daily outdoor play in all weather conditions (boots are preferred in the winter)
 - 👉 Indoor shoes can also be used for PE and in the gym.
- For Grades 2–5, indoor/PE shoes must have non-marking soles for use in the gym.

Every Day

- A healthy packed snack
- A healthy packed lunch (see slide about TommyTomato as a meal option)
- A water bottle
- Please label all items clearly with your child's name

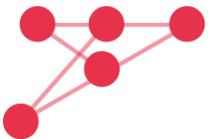
Early Years (Kindergarten to Grade 1)

- A complete set of clearly labelled spare clothes (shirt, trousers, underwear, and socks) in case of accidents
- Please pack these in a labelled ziplock bag

On PE days:

- Comfortable sports clothing (T-shirt, shorts, tracksuit trousers, or sweatshirt)
- No open-toe shoes for safety and comfort

To support independence, please dress your child in clothing and shoes they can manage themselves. Please also ensure your child is dressed appropriately for the weather, as we go outside every day, whatever the weather.



Primary – What to bring to school

Protective Outdoor Gear (KG–Grade 2: mandatory | Grade 3–5: recommended)

Primary students go outside during playtime every single day. Unless it is pouring with rain or there is a thunderstorm (safety), students go outside. It is important for students to get some fresh air, run around and burn off some energy enabling them to self-regulate for learning in the classroom.

During autumn, winter, and early spring, our playground can be muddy. Therefore:

- KG–Grade 2 students must wear waterproof outdoor gear (mud suit or waterproof trousers, jacket, and Wellington boots). These can be purchased from shops such as Decathlon, C&A, HEMA, etc.
- Grade 3–5 students are encouraged to have appropriate protective gear for muddy play, but it is not mandatory
- Protective gear is stored at school during the week and taken home on Friday to be cleaned and returned on Monday
- Teachers support KG–Grade 2 students in putting on their gear before going outside. In Grades 3–5, students are reminded that if they are not wearing appropriate clothing, they may not be able to play in muddy areas.



Primary – What to bring to school

Rainbow Class

- A complete set of clearly labelled spare clothes (shirt, trousers, underwear, and socks) in case of accidents
- Please pack these in a labelled ziplock bag
- For some students, [please have easy fastening velcro shoes](#) with a proper sole

Grade 2

As part of Physical Health Education (PHE), Grade 2 students attend swimming lessons. On swimming days, please provide:

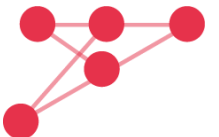
- A towel
- A swimming costume
- A separate bag for these items

Grades 2–5

On Physical Health Education (PHE) days, students should bring:

- A T-shirt
- Shorts or tracksuit trousers
- Socks
- Indoor PE/gym shoes with non-marking soles (required)

Students are expected to change independently into their PHE clothing.

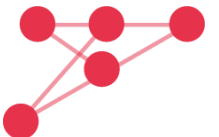


Secondary – Timetable

Secondary students (MYP and DP) will receive their personal timetable on the portal, Zermelo. This will be given out and explained on the first day of school.

School mostly finishes at 14.30 for secondary students however there are some days that classes will finish at 15:30 or 16:45. All questions regarding the new timetable will be answered during mentor time during the first days at school.

Parents will have access to the school's attendance app called Magister. Through the attendance app, parents can monitor their child's attendance records and lateness. Via the web-based Magister portal, parents can view their child's timetable as well as teacher-to-parent communications and notes, helping them stay informed about their child's progress and engagement at school.

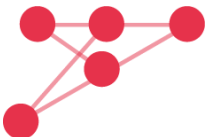

Secondary – Laptops

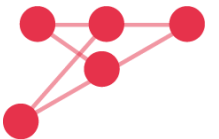
Families with children in primary are encouraged to have a device at home to help their child(ren) with their learning. All students from Grade 6 upwards are expected to have an Apple MacBook (Neo, Air or Pro) for educational purposes. Students are expected to purchase their laptop before joining the school. Students looking to purchase a laptop, can find details on the Admissions pages under School Fees on our website.

Apple MacBooks has proven to be a very durable, stable, efficient and versatile device, which has the benefit of being compatible with all software and devices we use at ISU. With proper care, this device should serve you well for more than 5 years. As everyone at ISU uses MacBooks, in combination with the extensive experience of our IT department, it is easy to find someone who can help at school, should there ever be any problems. As an added bonus, it also comes with easy to use, built-in parental controls called Screen Time so you can monitor (and if needed, prevent) any inappropriate use of the laptop together with your child.

MacBooks & insurance through ISU webshop

All students in secondary require their own personal Apple MacBook for school. The MacBook needs to be directly arranged by parents, and we recommend you use [the ISU web shop](#), for access to the Apple education discount on the prices all year round. We further recommend you also purchase 36 months of comprehensive insurance and repairs with your MacBook, which guarantees worldwide coverage.

The insurance entitles you to an unlimited number of claims. QSX insurances helps you with all repairs and damage and you can contact them: info@qsx-insurance.com, +31 88 0071007. Please note that if you do not purchase the insurance, you will have to arrange everything regarding repairs yourself.

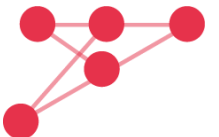

Outside the warranty there is another, cheaper option: AWB Computing, + 30 233 4061, address: Amsterdamsestraatweg 75, Utrecht. If you say you are from International School Utrecht, you will receive a 10% discount. However, please note this is not an Apple Certified Repair centre, so any remaining warranty will be broken if you go here.

Attendance and Absenteeism

Every child in the Netherlands has both a right to education and the obligation to attend school. International School Utrecht (ISU) provides a welcoming, safe and supportive learning environment. The Dutch Compulsory Education Act (leerplichtwet) applies to everyone living in the Netherlands, and compulsory education starts on the first day of the new month after a child turns 5 until the end of the school year in which a child turns 18 at ISU.

Reporting absence

Reporting sick

When a student is absent due to sickness or another legitimate reason, parents are requested to inform the school before 07:30 each day the child is absent. This must be done via the school App.

Reporting appointments

When a student has an appointment that cannot be booked outside school hours, please notify the school before 07:30 via the school App. Please always try to book appointments (doctor, dentist, or municipal) outside of school hours to ensure your child does not miss school unnecessarily. Students are expected to attend school before and/or after all appointments.

Sick during the day

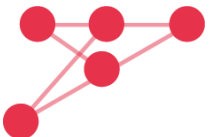
When a student feels sick at school, the Welcome Desk will contact the parent(s) and the student must sign out at the desk.

Lateness

Students are expected to be in class by 08:30. If a student is late, they will report to the Welcome Desk.

Primary student's parents will be invited to a meeting in cases of repeated lateness.

Secondary students swipe in using their student card; the attendance coordinator will be involved, and students may have to report early the following day.



Exceptional leave

In accordance with the Compulsory Education Act, leave outside of the school holidays is **not allowed**. Parents must plan holidays and special events during the official school holidays and in accordance with the school calendar. Exceptional leave can be granted only in very significant circumstances.

The local attendance authority (leerplicht) is responsible for parental compliance with the Dutch Compulsory Education Act and works with ISU in upholding the law. If parents decide to take leave without permission, it can mean parents will be contacted by the attendance authorities (leerplicht). This could also lead to legal proceedings and the imposition of a fine.

Sick during the day

The student reports sick at the Welcome Desk.

The Welcome Desk contacts parent(s).

Students must be signed out on leaving.



Appointments during the day

Try to arrange appointments outside of school hours.

For appointments, notify the school the **same day before 07:30** via the App.

Emergency? Please provide further information in the App.



Late

Primary: Parents are responsible for the sign-in of students arriving from 08:30 at the welcome desk

Secondary: Students are responsible for swiping in at the welcome desk with their student card if they arrive late to classes.



Exceptional leave

Only in very 'exceptional' circumstances can permission be given to be absent from school.

School app

The School App is our whole school platform of communication, and we ask you to:

Please download the ISUtrecht App from the Apple or Google Play stores.

On 28 August 2026 new families will receive an automated email (in Dutch) from 'ParentCom' with a link to set a password. In the app click on 'Messages' and then enter the email address on which you have received the app password link and the newly created password. Please ensure you leave Notifications on. Please login to the app within 24 hours of receiving the email and check your Junk mailbox if you have not received it by the end of that day.

Do check that you have access to all communication and that you have your child/ren linked by clicking on the 'Messages' block. There you should see a welcome message already in the app. At the top click on 'Personal information' where you should see all your children's names.

Tools and Platforms for communication

Primary

At the start of the new school year, the PYP will start transitioning from ManageBac to Toddle, our new learning management platform.

Toddle has been designed specifically for IB schools and brings curriculum planning, learning, assessment, portfolios, reporting and home-school communication together in one easy-to-use platform. This change will help us create a more connected learning experience for students, teachers and families while strengthening our implementation of the IB Primary Years Programme.

For parents, Toddle will gradually become the main platform for following your child's learning journey and will take the place of SeeSaw and Managebac. We understand that any new platform brings questions, and we are committed to supporting families throughout the process.

After the summer holiday, we will share further information, including guides and login details, and invite all parents to an information session where we will introduce Toddle, demonstrate its features and answer any questions you may have.

We are excited about the opportunities this new platform will bring and look forward to sharing this next step with our school community.

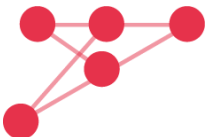

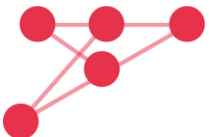

Travelling to school

Every morning from 08:00 we open the school for primary and secondary students. There will be teachers and support staff to welcome students into the Aula. Kindergarten students will be collected from the Aula at 08:20 by the Teaching Assistants; all other primary students can make their own way to their classrooms at 08:20. The secondary students can wait in the secondary library. Our school is easily reached by bike, public transport and car.

Bicycle

This is the most popular way to travel to school, and we strongly recommend this. Please use the designated parking. Parked bicycles should always be locked.

Park and Ride

You are encouraged to use the Park and Ride (P+R) should you wish to bring your child into school by car. This is a service you can use free for 45 minutes at the beginning of the day. The Park and Ride facility is called P+R Papendorp. Please use the P+R for all parent events.

Kiss & Ride

If you wish to bring your child to school by car for a quick drop off, you can use the Kiss & Ride. Kiss & Ride under the strict conditions that parents use this facility for what it is for. This means parents do not leave the car and children make their own way into school.

Families who pick up children from After School Activities and/or BSO can park at the school parking.



After School Childcare

BSO – ‘*Buitenschoolse opvang*’

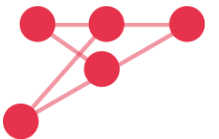

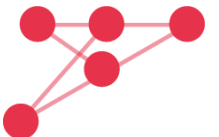

Daycare Woudrijk in Papendorp

For families looking for daycare for younger brothers and sisters, Kind & Co Ludens has a daycare facility in Papendorp near the school. The group is specifically intended for children whose home language is English, or any language other than Dutch. The group is bilingual. One pedagogical staff member will speak English, while the other will speak Dutch. Woudrijk is located at the Tirionlaan 1 at Utrecht Papendorp, close to the big bridge. Woudrijk is easily accessible by car via the A2 and A12.

What does Woudrijk daycare centre offer?

We offer childcare to 0–4-year-olds, divided over a number of different groups. The use of natural materials and colours in our spaces creates a sense of calm. A variety of developmental toys and materials are available for the children to discover and play with. We have an outdoor play area with a playpen for the babies, a sandpit, a play frame, and a vegetable garden so that the children can play and discover both indoors and outside.

The staff offer a safe environment, both physically and socially-emotionally, and they track the children's development. We follow a regular daily schedule of theme-based activities such as story-reading, singing, playing, and crafting. We also regularly offer workshops such as music.

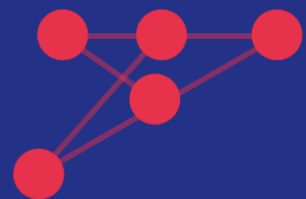
